Dear faithful First family and friends,

As I write this article, I'm preparing for a final meeting with the Transition Team as they meet with the Council and the newly elected Call Committee members to review the final version of the Ministry Site Profile (MSP), which is the fundamental document for our time of transition. In fact, through your efforts of taking surveys, participating in the focused conversation small groups, and meeting with me in the one-on-ones, you played a key part in helping the Transition Team create this document. So, Thanks to each of you for helping in this important task. Now, this document will be sent to our Synodical Bishop Andrew "Andy" Taylor for final approval, and after receiving his approval, we move into the final phase of our transition time here at First Lutheran Church in San Diego.

The MSP becomes our testimony for who we are as a congregation; this document will be read and reviewed by candidates seeking and discerning the call to become our next pastor. The journey has taken us through some difficult emotions of grief and sadness and loss, but also with a heightened expectation of joy and wonder about what God has in store for us. And now, we enter this final stage.

I would like to publicly commend the Transition Team, those nine individuals who met weekly to engage in this crucial work. Even amidst the sudden death of Pastor Larry Koger in December, the Transition Team made sure to continue their work and the task of hearing from each of you about your needs and desires and hopes and dreams for our congregation. And so **Thanks** to the Transition Team members: **Chuck Leib (the chair), Allison Emery, Lee Kaercher, Dan Kjonegaard, Dick Krueger, Melinda Person, David Pohl, Shaun Travers, and Robin Withers.** Soon we will release these persons from their duties and responsibilities as members of the Transition Team. But again, *Many Thanks* are due to these nine people for working diligently on your behalf. **Great job, Transition Team!**

On July 9, I will install the members of the Call Committee and I wanted to take this opportunity to *Thank* the following nine individuals, who have been elected to serve on this Committee. **Paul Engel, Lori Gremel, Mary Ann Horton, Patricia Lindquist, Nance Lovell, Richard Phillips, Ladonna Piper, David Pohl (representing the Transition Team), and Carol Schultz (representing the Council).** I would ask each of you to hold these nine people in prayer during their work.

It is indeed an exciting time here at First Lutheran Church. And, as always, I am blessed to be among you.

Council Update: "Don't Push the River"

Perhaps you didn't know that Council meetings begin with a devotion chosen and presented by a Council member or the pastor. Our June devotion was a meditation written by Fr. Richard Rohr, founder of the Center for Action and Contemplation in Albuquerque, New Mexico. Titled "Don't Push the River," it addresses trust and describes a keystone of the Council's approach to our work. In part, this meditation reads:

"I believe that faith might be the ability to trust the river, to trust the flow and [God] the Lover...Faith does not need to push the river precisely because it is able to trust that *there is a river*. The river is flowing; we are in it. The river is God's providential love—so do not be afraid...To stay in God's holding means that I have to let go of myself, at least to some degree. I have to be able to hold a certain degree of uncertainty, ambiguity, and tension. Paradoxically, this leads to a much calmer and more content way of 'being in control!' All the frenzy and fear disappear."

With that meditation as a foundation, Council business included the following key items.

1. **Call Committee.** The most significant action the Council took was selecting members of the Call Committee that will continue the task of finding our next pastor. As you recall, the Transition Team is the first of two groups engaged in this task; the Call Committee is the second. The Transition Team just completed drafting First Lutheran's Ministry Site Profile, which will go to the Synod. With this information, the Synod will identify pastoral candidates for the Call Committee's consideration. After reviewing applications for the Call Committee, the Council used a written ballot to select Paul Engel, Lori Gremel, Mary Ann Horton, Patricia Lindquist, Nance Lovell, Richard Phillips, Ladonna Piper, David Pohl (Transition Team liaison), and Carol Schultz (Council liaison). The Council is grateful to everyone who submitted an application to serve on the Call Committee!
2. **Budget and finances.** The Council continues to monitor income and expenditures closely to maintain a balanced budget. For example, we agreed to spend general revenue to repair the broken stained glass window now and to defer tree trimming on the premises until next year. In addition, donated funds will pay to replace the burned-out exterior lights with long-lasting LED lights.
3. **Website.** After reviewing three proposals, the Council chose White Wonder Studios to create a WordPress website to replace the current HTML-based website. Key factors in making this selection were affordability, expertise, and consultant's responsiveness. A WordPress format is much easier to update than HTML and, with a modest amount of training, the Office Administrator will be able to keep the new website current.
4. **Nursery attendants.** Several months ago, both of First Lutheran's nursery attendants resigned. Since then, the congregation has relied on Panda's Agency, a placement service, for two nursery attendants, which costs significantly more than budgeted. The Council has advertised these positions widely without success. Balancing the need for a nursery with the need to manage costs, the Council approved hiring one nursery attendant from Panda's and requesting congregation members to fill the other position on a rotating basis starting August 1.

As Council members, we appreciate the trust you have placed in us and we welcome your questions and comments on matters that you care about.

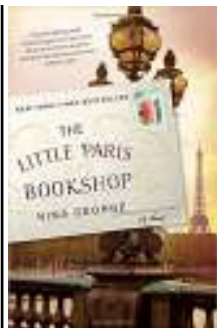

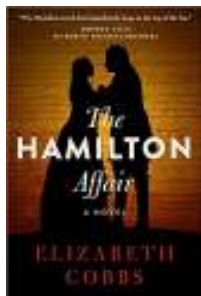
Join us for lively discussion and warm fellowship on Thursday, July 20, 7:00PM at the Community Room of Susan White's condo in Banker's Hill.
