Dear faithful First family and friends,

Alleluia! Christ is risen!

Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia!

With those words, on Easter Sunday, we announced yet again the mystery of the Resurrection of Christ. We brought out that wonderful word “Alleluia” that had been buried, left unspoken for the season of Lent. And then joyfully—and *enthusiastically*—we proclaimed that Christ is risen! Alleluia! Just what is Alleluia and why is it such a powerful word for the Church?



Alleluia or Hallelujah is a word that means, roughly, Praise God. It appears 24 times in the Old Testament (mainly in the Psalms) and 4 times in the New Testament book of Revelation. And in case you were curious, on our Easter Sunday celebration a couple of weeks ago, we sang, chanted, or spoke “Alleluia” an unbelievable 236 times! We certainly did quite of bit of “Praising God” while celebrating the Resurrection of Christ. But the Alleluias haven’t subsided just yet. We will continue to proclaim and shout Praise God as an Alleluia as we continue our Easter journey during the seasons of Easter. So, two questions have been on my mind as I’ve been wondering, “How do you praise God?” and “How do you live out an ‘Alleluia’ in your own life?”

Certainly, we praise God as we gather for worship. As this First family of faith, our voices collectively declare our vocal praise for the One who brought us into this relationship. In other words, with our voices—individually and as a community—we declare our praise to God out loud. But here are some other ways you Praise God that I’d like you to think about.

We praise God with our bodies. Think about the times in our worship service that you “move around” while sharing the Peace of Christ. Or think about when our bodies get up from our seats and we gather at the Table to feast on the Presence of Christ. Or think about those times when we “cross” ourselves in honoring the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Each of these is a praising of God in one way or another.

We praise God with our thoughts and minds as we read Scripture, letting it work in, through, and among our entire beings. Sometimes, we read these words out loud, but perhaps at home in your quiet, personal devotional lives, those words are uttered silently as your eyes move along the pages of your Bible or iPhone or Kindle or some other way of engaging your eyes with the words. As you do this, you are praising God with these Words written for the nurturing of your faith.

Are there other ways you live out an Alleluia? Ways in which you Praise God beyond speaking words? The point, of course, of all of this is that our Alleluias are not just spoken praises through words. Rather, we can praise God with our actions and deeds. We can Praise God when we give our time and talents and treasures.

But for now, I’d like to end with another **ALLELUIA** because sometimes, that word itself is the best word as it evokes and conveys the ultimate Praise to our Risen Christ and the love of God for each of us.

Easter Reflection: Council Update

Three years ago, I was a member of Grace Lutheran in Boulder, CO, when Easter Sunday greeted us with fresh snow! Although pure white snow has marvelous Easter symbolism, I'm delighted to be in San Diego again where we celebrate Easter with warm sun and ocean breezes. And to be at First Lutheran where Easter joy resounds throughout the worship service. Of course, then Monday comes and what happens? At our April Council meeting, President Kathryn Kanaan led us in reflecting on ways to keep the Easter spirit alive in the days that follow that magnificent celebration. No one mentioned meeting for 2.5 hours to discuss the business of being "the heart of Christ in the heart of the City," but that's what we did.

At the Council's meeting on April 18, 2017, we focused on the following items.

- **Finances:** Although January and February income was higher than projected, the accountant's most recent financial report indicates income declined during March. Overall, income for the year to date is about 5-7% less than projected in the 2017 budget. The Financial Committee is keeping a close eye on our financial picture, and the Council is minimizing spending on discretionary budget items as promised at the annual congregation meeting. Everyone's careful attention to expenditures has kept them below the amounts budgeted so First Lutheran continues to operate in the black.
- **TACO's Lift Project:** For more than a year, TACO has been refining a plan to install a lift that would carry people and supplies to their second floor office and clinic space. Now, with the help of donated matching funds, they are within about \$7,500 of the total required. TACO is planning a targeted campaign to individual donors to achieve this goal. Because the Council decided to keep First Lutheran's contributor records confidential, TACO will base its appeal on its own donor records including First Lutheran members who've donated to TACO. (Note that most Council members are not privy to First Lutheran's contributor records.) Please watch the kiosk in the lounge for updates from TACO.
- **Property:** The Property Committee and a group of hardy individuals have cleaned and repaired walls, baseboards, windows, and furniture as well completed small jobs too numerous to mention in order to make First Lutheran shine for Easter Sunday. And they still have a list of items to be tackled. In the near future, you will have an opportunity to let the Committee know about your skills for these tasks. Please respond enthusiastically; we save a significant amount of money this way.
- **October Retreat:** Pr. Darryl Kozak and Spiritual Director Beth Slevcove are in the early planning stages for a retreat Oct. 13-15, 2017, at the Franciscan Retreat Center at Old Mission San Luis Rey near Oceanside CA. Stay tuned for further information.

As you look for ways to celebrate Easter in the mundane parts of your week, please pause to give thanks for our life together at First Lutheran and our partnership with TACO. And remember that Council members welcome your questions and concerns.

changes once the pastor comes. Thank you for the openness in feelings and ideas.

- **Policies, procedures, and documentation:** Completing an audit, setting standard practices for groups using the facilities (forms, fees, etc.), updating the Constitution and Bylaws to be compliant with ELCA guidelines, send thank you notes to non-member large givers
- **Outreach to neighboring churches:** get to know each other's ministries, interdenominational clergy meetings to keep connected with the pulse, youth participate in national conferences and local events (i.e. with Pastor Karen's youth)
- **Formalize facility maintenance:** time and talents survey, who and when to call for issues, enact workday group
- **Improve pledge process**
- **Staff:** goals for 2017, Jared's Chautauqua dates, update/create job descriptions
- **Music:** expand choir, special music throughout year
- **Be more welcoming to members and guests:** reemphasize our bond during transition, contact members that have been missing, new visitor follow-up by greeter committee
- **Children participate in both services:** children sing in church on a set schedule to create excitement with parents and grandparents, help with offering during first service, acolyte, have a Youth Sunday
- **Commune in groups:** try something new this summer
- **Plan for growth:** outreach to community, new member classes

Transition Team News:

The Transition Team has been busy at work. You may recall that when Bishop Finck visited our congregation at the time that Pastor Miller was leaving, he assured us that the Transition/Call process has been used, successfully, by many congregations within the ELCA. We are following that process closely. We knew the transition process would begin toward the end of November 2016, and it did. The Transition Team was presented with a timeline to follow that would take us from November 2016 through mid-June 2017. Even with the untimely death of Pastor Larry we are on target to finish our work by mid-June. Shortly after that, we will meet with the Church Council and the Call Committee (which will be selected around then) to discuss our findings and supply those groups with a Ministry Site Profile. The Call Committee and the Church Council then take over the proves of finding our permanent pastor. The multiple surveys that we send and the focused conversations that we schedule assure that all members of the congregation have the opportunity to add their input to the process. We all want to find the right leader for our congregation. We are in excellent hands with Pastor Darryl until that permanent pastor is found. Thank you for working with us and supporting the Transition Team on the path to that goal.

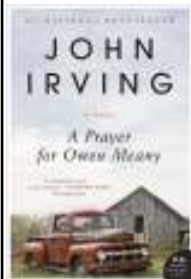
The Call Committee

The Transition Team is nearing the end of its task of building a Ministry Site Profile. The next major step in our journey toward selecting a permanent pastor for First Lutheran is to form the Call Committee that will make a recommendation to the congregation. The Call Committee will be selected by the Church Council in late June and will continue to meet until a new pastor is approved by the congregation. Past experiences have shown that it is very likely that the Call Committee will need six months or more to finalize its recommendation.

During this period the primary duties of the Call Committee will be to:

- Meet on a weekly basis
- Study the Ministry Site Profile that was prepared by the Transition Team
- Develop interview questions
- Review qualifications of prospective candidates submitted by the Synod
- Screen candidates and interview those who appear promising
- View or attend a sermon of those candidates
- Contact candidate references
- Notify the Synod if more candidates are desired
- Present a recommendation for congregation approval

In the next few weeks, the church will be asking for the names of members who would like to be considered for the Call Committee. A form is being developed where you will be asked to provide information about yourself. That information will then go to the Council, who will select a Call Committee that they believe is balanced and represents the congregation. **Please note that if you have previously stated you would like to be considered for the Call Committee, you will still be required to complete and submit one of these forms.**

Join FLC's Book Club for a discussion of John Irving's *A Prayer for Owen Meany*

First Lutheran's book club continues to explore literature of all kinds, fiction and non-fiction, older favorites and hot new releases. The upcoming selection, John Irving's *A Prayer for Owen Meany* is sure to generate an interesting conversation. We will meet at the home of Ladonna Piper on Thursday, May 18th at 7PM.

The novel, set in the 1950s in the prep school town of Gravesend, is an extraordinary account of friendship, coming of age, families, "normalcy," politics, faith, and doubt. The title character is an unusually small child—as an adult barely five feet tall—with a strange and striking voice that makes many people uneasy.

The only son of a New Hampshire granite quarrier and his odd and reclusive wife, Owen is best friends with Johnny Wheelwright, the narrator of the book and grandson of one of the town's most distinguished families. The friendship is sealed by a freak accident when Owen hits a baseball that kills Johnny's mother, Tabitha, who is just arriving at the game.

The remainder of the novel is a back-and-forth between past and present as Johnny searches for his identity—his mother is unmarried and never reveals the father's name—and Owen searches for his destiny—he believes that he is an instrument of God. Both searches have amazing resolutions.

We hope you will join us for fun, food, beverages (yes, wine—it's a book club!) and fellowship. All are welcome!
